Dr. Matthew Myers

Director



Dr. Matthew Myers is beginning his second season as Artistic Director of the Palouse Choral Society. He serves as associate director of choral activities and assistant professor of choral music education at Washington State University. He conducts the University Singers and Treble Choir and teaches courses in music education methods and conducting. He is the co-host of the Choir Fam Podcast.

He earned his DMA in choral conducting at Louisiana State University, his master's degree in choral conducting at Northern Arizona University, and his bachelor's

degree in vocal performance and music education at Luther College. After completing his degree at Luther, he taught grades 6-12 choir at The American International School of Muscat in Oman. For the following five years, he worked as director of choirs and musical theatre at Boylan Catholic High School in Rockford, Illinois. In addition to conducting five choirs, he taught AP music theory, class piano, and critical thinking and coordinated a middle school choral program at four of Boylan's constituent grade schools. He has served as conductor of the NAU Men's Chorale and Chamber Singers, the LSU Chamber Singers, the Master Chorale of Flagstaff, and the Flagstaff Youth Chorale and has held church music positions in Iowa, Illinois, Louisiana, and Alabama. Prior to his time at WSU, Dr. Myers taught at the University of Alabama, where he conducted two choirs and taught courses in music appreciation, choral literature, vocal pedagogy, and diction. He is a frequent choral clinician, guest conductor, presenter, and adjudicator. Recent engagements include conducting the WSU Treble Choir at NAfME's Northwest Division Conference in Bellevue, WA; presenting at the NAfME National Conference in Washington, DC; and conducting the Idaho ACDA Middle School All-State Chorus in Pocatello, ID.

He has sung professionally with Red Shift, Coro Vocati, the Sedona Academy of Chamber Singers, and Elysian Voices, and he has also performed the tenor solos in works such as Bach's *Christ lag in Todensbanden*, Vaughan Williams's *Serenade to Music*, Bernstein's *Mass*, Johnson's *Considering Matthew Shepard*, and Handel's *Messiah*.



A coloratura soprano originally from Alberta, Canada, Alisa holds a MM in Vocal Performance and Choral Conducting from the University of Idaho and a Bachelors degree in Music Education from Mississippi University for Women. She performed in the role of Pamina in Mozart's *The Magic Flute* and Gertrude in Hänsel and Gretel. Her soloing opportunities include with the Palouse Choral Society, Washington Idaho Symphony, Mississippi State Symphony Choir and Orchestra, the Columbus Choral Society, and the Greeley Chorale and Philharmonic Orchestra. In addition to the U.S., Alisa soloed in Great Britain, Canada, and Italy including a concert for Pope Benedict

XVI with the Rome Symphony Orchestra. She recently won the University of Idaho Concerto/Aria Competition and placed first in the Southern Region NATS vocal competition while living in Mississippi. Alisa enjoyed teaching K-12 music for several years in public and private schools and is in her 30th year of teaching voice and piano through her private studio, Singingtoy Studio.

Stephanie Sant received her Bachelor of Music in K-12 Vocal Music Education and her Master of Education in Curriculum and Instruction from the University of Idaho. She studied voice with noted vocalist and professor Dorothy Barnes. Ms. Sant has taught K-6 General Music at A.B. McDonald Elementary School in Moscow and currently conducts the Moscow High School Choir and extra-curricular jazz choir Encore. She also teaches movement and dance at McDonald Elementary, her 25th year in Moscow School District. She has conducted the PCS children's choir for 5 years. Stephanie is active in the national music fraternity Sigma Alpha Iota, which promotes and supports music education and fine arts in schools and communities. She

participates in American Choral Directors Association and the National Association for Music Education. Ms. Sant enjoys singing in the Chamber Choir and Chorale and in the community as a soloist.



Dr. Deborah Collins has been the Children's Choir pianist since 2022 and enjoys singing with the Chorale and Chamber Choir as well. She studied piano performance at Iowa State University prior to deciding to go into medicine and has accompanied university choirs, church choirs, and voice students, directed a youth choir, and sung with multiple collegiate and community choirs in the past. Dr. Collins is currently a family physician at WSU's Cougar Health Services and obtained her MD from Duke University School of Medicine and Master of Science in Public Health from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She lives in Pullman with her husband Brian and their three daughters Sophie, Lucy, and Violet, all of whom have also sung with the Palouse Choral Society.

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Palouse Choral Society 2nd Annual Composition Contest

The Palouse Choral Society eagerly announces the winner and runners-up of our second annual composition contest. PCS established this contest in 2022 as part of our goal to perform new music and champion the works of emerging composers. Composers submitted their works this spring for review by a panel of choral conductors before our three top works were selected. The winning composer received a \$500 honorarium, and we will perform their piece today.

Zach Busch (he/they) is based in Madison, Wisconsin. A graduate of Luther College (B.A. in Music) and Luther Seminary (Master of Sacred Music), Zach works primarily as a parish church musician, directing choirs and playing piano and organ. He also works in the musical theater world, most recently music directing *Hedwig and the Angry Inch* with StageQ, Madison. Zach has been writing music in some form since childhood. His composing has been inspired by and rooted in the church's liturgy, and he most often writes for contextual use in worship. Zach wrote "Julian's Benediction" early in the pandemic, when

choral singing was relegated for a time to only memory and hope. In that time of isolation, Julian of Norwich became a particular inspiration for him, and Zach leaned in to composition as a companion and a productive challenge. James Keller (he/him) is a composer, conductor, and baritone from Kansas City, Missouri. James received his Bachelor of Music in Composition from the University of Missouri - Kansas City, where he studied with Pulitzer Prize-winning composers Chen Yi and Zhou Long among other distinguished faculty, and his Master of Music in Choral Conducting at Louisiana State University. As a composer, James' music has been commissioned and performed by ensembles from the high school to professional levels across the United States, including the award-winning Los Angeles-based ensemble Choral Arts Initiative and the historic

LSU A Capella Choir. As a conductor, James has worked as assistant conductor and clinician for high school and collegiate groups in Missouri and Louisiana, and is the founder and Artistic Director of BRACE New Music Choir, the Baton Rouge-New Orleans area's first dedicated New Music chorus. James' music is available for purchase with Santa Barbara Music Publishing and MusicSpoke.



Guy Worthey, Wyoming native, traded spurs and lassos for telescopes and computers when he decided to pursue astrophysics as a career. Whenever he temporarily escapes the gravitational pull of stars and galaxies, he writes fiction, plays jazz bass, and enjoys gardening. He likes both cats and dogs, and is currently the devoted servant of Finn the orange-white cat. Childhood piano lessons ricocheted into teenage rock band membership. A high school jazz class ignited an unquenchable love for that unfettered and uniquely American music genre, and he has played jazz ever since—blowing trombone, scat singing, thumping bass, or

tickling the keys. Although he's a devoted jazzer, he happily stretches genre boundaries to find common musical ground with his classical violinist wife Diane. He is thrilled to have placed in the Palouse Choral Society's composition contest, and even more thrilled to have inflicted this earworm, "Journey On," on others. He had heard that the only way to shed a really catchy melody is to give it away. He reports, alas, that this rumor is pure hokum, and still finds himself humming it at odd moments.
